Our next even is the annual picnic, July 19 at the Edmonds City Pank. Please plan to attend. Bring that new retires that was your reighbor across the hall for all those



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - GORDON BOWERS, Legislative Chairman



There have been some changes in the WSRTA Legislative Committee - the new Chairman is Leonard Ozmun from Puyallup, replacing Neal Nogler. Working closely with the Legislative Committee will be newly appointed WSRTA Liaison for Government Affairs, Norm Schutt from Olympia. He was Chairman of the Senior Citizens' Lobby for many years, has previously been a lobbyist for state employees.

The Washington State Legislature's "Joint Committee on Pension Policy" (JCPP) will meet July 16, Sept. 17, Oct. 19 and Dec. 17 on various agenda items pertaining to all of the retirement systems - PERS, TRS, LEOFF, STATE PATROL, etc. The JCPP will consider only those legislative requests that come with the approval of the "Senior Citizens' Coalition", made up of 23 organizations including WSRTA. Reaching an accord for any specific legislation will be difficult. However, WSRTA has three bills ready for the 1991 Legislature - COLA improvement for Plan I retirees, State supplement for Health Care Costs, and reduction of the retirement age for Plan II (active teachers).

SOCIAL SECURITY ALERT - The NRTA Bulletin for June/ July has an article warning retirees that certain members of Congress are pushing to cut Social Security payments to help balance the budget due to the skyrocketing cost of the Savings & Loan bailout. Also, the media is appealing for letters to congressmen urging action to recover dollars from those benefitting from this fraud. John Hinterberger, Seattle Times Columnist (6/24/90) Pleads for citizens' awakening to this rip-off: "Cost will be at least \$5000 for every houshold in the nation - this is the greatest Rip-Off of the ordinary taxpayer in the entire history of the United States."
