# LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - GENE OLMSTED


The bills that we need to give our full support to this year in the legislature are SB 5508 in the Senate and an identical bill in the House, HB 583. These bills would do two things; raise the base pay of those teachers who retired years ago and give all retired teachers who qualify an automaatic COLA each year starting July 1, 1989. Here are the provisions of these bills:

Raisc \$13.00 base effective July 1 -

- a. 1987 to \$20.00 per month per year of service,
- b. 1988 to \$28.00 per month per year of service,
- 1989 and each year thereafter: a COLA based upon the Seattle CPI, capped at 3%, to each retiree who has 20 years or more of service credit.
- d. No retiree would receive a COLA until he/she has been retired for a period of five years.

Two other bills that we may be called on to support are SB 5509 and HB 584. In 1973 the state legislature passed a bill intended to give COLAs to state pensioners, capped at 3%. Retired teachers have never received one cent in any pension increase under this bill, but PERS under the same provisions of this bill received annual increases of 3% each year 1974 through 1980. These bills would eliminate the restrictive provisions of this law and place retired teachers on the same standing as PERS in this matter.

There are other retirement bills in the state legislature this year, but only the above bills have the official support of our state legislative committee and our fulltime, but not paid lobbyists, Harold Anderson and Dr. Stayner Brighton. So now is the ti to write to your legislators! Tell why you think these bills are fair and equitable and how they will affect you personally.
