HEALTH CARE CAMPAIGN

AARP is using all its resources in a huge health care campaign across the nation. The entire health delivery system for the nation is weak. and Medicare's deteriorating financial condition merely is symptomatic of that overlying weakness. System-wide reforms applicable to all providers and purchasers are needed. AARP's nation-wide health care campaign is designed to achieve several general goals:

- * To reduce the rate of cost escalation in health care.
- * To preserve and strengthen the Medicare and Medicaid programs and asssure the availability of affordable health care for all citizens.
- * To encourage the development of alternative health delivery systems such as Health Maintenance Organiza tions, home health and ambulatory care services that can be more responsive to consumer needs and more efficient in the delivery of current institutional systems.
- * To encourage Americans of all ages to adopt and practice more healthful lifestyles.
- * To provide information to consumers on health care costs and options.


