

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Bowers

News items worth reading - Modern Maturity, Sept. 1986 NRTA edition of AARP, pp. 86-7. Kermit Franks, immediate Past Pres. of the Washington Retired Teachers Association is quoted on the problems of A LACK OF COLAS for Washington's retired teachers. It's good publicity to see this problem brought to the attention of 20 million readers.

Also worth reading - WSRTA JOURNAL, Oct. 1986, P. 8 - LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE PLANS COLA STUDY AS PRIMARY GOAL - - in essence, a two day workshop was held Oct. 21-22 in Olympia to train teams of two who will come to each legislative district, conduct a two and one half four seminar for all RTA unit members, topicswill include: 1. A COLA is absolutely necessary - inflation is not over. 2. A COLA is not a gift, it is earned - 28% of our income was with-light from our paychecks for pension funding while we were working. 3. Other retirees in the State are getting a far hetter deal than retired teachers. 4. Retired teachers will need to put all possible pressure on legislators in the 1987 session.

Good news for Michigan retired teachers - NRTA NEWS BULLETIN, Sept 1986, P.14. Retired teachers in Michigan received a 1986 increase of 8% and an automatic 3% per year annual increase in the future. A SIMILAR LAW AS PASSED THE WASHINGTON STATE LEGISLATURE IN 1973, PROVIDING FOR A 3% ANNUAL COLA. ND COLA PAYMENT HAS EVER BEEN MADE TO RETIRED TEACHERS UNDER THAT LAW - RCW 41.32.499. Section 6 of the law states.."Each service retirement allowance payable from July 1st of any year after 1973 until any subsequent adjustment pursuant to this subsection shall be adjusted so as to equal the product of the cost-of-living factor for such year and the amount of said retirement allowance on the initial date of payment." Then, a "zinger clause" was thrown in Section 6... "Provided, that the board finds, at its sole discretion, that the cost of such adjustments shall have been met by the excess of the growth in the assets of the system over that required for meeting the actuarial liabilities of the system at that time." This loophole was the leak in the dike, and never plugged.

Fourteen years have passed since the COLA law was passed, but the Legislature each year has found ways to avoid paying. In the interim, purchasing power of pension checks has eroded to less than half of the original purchasing power.
