#### LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - GORDON BOWERS AND GENE OLMSTED

Some progress was made on legislative concerns of retired teachers. These bills passed and are on the governor's desk: SB 3847 permits retired teachers to continue to receive Teachers Retirement System payments while working in public education out of state. SB 376, effective July 1, 1986, as a cost of living adjustment - no beneficiary receiving a retirement allowance shall receive as the pension portion of that retirement allowance less than \$13 per month for each year of service creditable to the person whose service is the basis of the pension. (This applies to those who retired before 1973, some of whom are receiving as little as \$300 per month after 30 years teaching. There is a very great differential in pensions, ranging from \$300 to \$1,500 per month based on 30 years of teaching. A comparable worth adjustment is long overdue.)

ESSB 3458 requires an appropriate reduction in auto insurance rates to those over 55 years of age upon completion of an approved defensive driving course.

Other bills affecting senior citizens were passed and are awaiting the governor's signature. These will be reviewed in the May Sno-King RTA Bulletin. Our thanks to the telephone committee and all who called their legislators!

#### CELEBRITY VOLUNTEER


