LEGISLATIVE UPDATE - Gordon Bowers

The CATASTROPHIC CARE BILL will soon reach the White House. It will not be of much help to the two thirds of Medicare recipients who carry supplemental health insurance, which covers most catastrophic illness. The bill in Congress does not cover the most catastrophic of all - nursing home care. Who will benefit the most? The 30 percent of the elderly who have no supplementary "Medigap" coverage, and aren't poor enough for Medicaid. For them, the extra cost will be small and the returns large. For all others, the cost will be high, and the returns will be low. SUPPLEMENTAL INSURANCE WILL STILL BE NEEDED, TOO.

WSRTA COLA BILL for the 1988 Legislature - To each person who established membership in the Teachers' REtirement System under Plan I (before July 1, 1977) and who has been retired for at least five years: An annual COLA of 3% or less, based on the Seattle CPI, beginning July 1, 1989.





Parking, however, is limited. School will be in session and the student parking lot will be filled. You may park on the <u>EAST</u> side of 25th Avenue NE. Additional parking space is available north of the auditorium in the King County Park & Ride lot near Kellogg Middle School. (See map below.)

Please plan to car-pool. We will have one or two cars to shuttle members and guests from the Park & Ride lot on 25th Avenue NE.

DIRECTIONS: Exit I-5 (North or South-bound) at Exit #175 (N.E. 145th Street) and drive east toward Lake Washington, passing electric signals at 15th NE and 20th NE. Turn left (to north) on 25th NE to Shorecrest High school or the Park & Ride lot a little north of the school.

Adjustments can be made if you are coming from SR #522 (along Bothell Way NE or from I-405 via Bothell) or from Aurora, crossing the I-5 freeway at 5th NE and NE 145th if you are driving old US 99 (Aurora Avenue.)
