She also commented on a new program, Phonics Curriculum, that is being introduced this year. Eighty-eight percent of the budget goes towards staff cost. The District may have a \$16 million dollar shortfall this year. She shared photos taken at the Kindergarten Fair.

Then Joel Underwood, a history teacher at Evergreen College and a musician, was introduced. His topic was Arlo Guthrie and his songs. He told us why "Roll on Columbia" was written and then sang it for us. He talked about the challenge Guthrie portrayed in his songs to keep the American spirit alive. He finished with a sing-along of "This Is Your Land".
