The following motion was made, seconded and passed by the Sno-King RTA Executive Board at its meeting of May 13, 1987.

## RE: PROPOSED WSRTA DUES INCREASE

The WSRTA Executive Board's 1987-88 proposed budget will require a minimum annual dues increase to \$13.00 to support anticipated expenditures. Also, a resolution on dues increase will be proposed at the WSRTA Convention in Pasco to increase dues \$4.00 per membership month or a increase to \$48 on an annual 12-month basis. This is a 380% increase on the current \$10.

Also noted in the Board's proposed budget is the withdrawal of \$30,000 from the reserve fund to balance the budget.

The Executive Board of the Sno-King RTA chapter opposes both these proposals and has requested its delegates to vote "NO" on both proposals when they come to the floor of the WSRTA Convention.

The Sno-King RTA desires budgets to reflect long-term planning and to be more carefully crafted prior to adoption. Balancing the budget by continuing to deplete cash reserves of WSRTA is not a satisfactory long-term solution. Any dues increase which is not related to future goals and activities should not be proposed by the WSRTA Executive Board.

WSRTA should continue to support special and critical projects by means of voluntary contributions, some on a "one-time only" basis. The T.R.I.P system of funding is recommended instead of including "estimated" or "anticipated" costs in dues-based contingency items.

Sno-King RTA recommends that the WSRTA Executive Board limit any dues increase to take effect in 1987-88 to an annual amount of \$15 or a \$5 increase. Further, it is recommended that \$2 of this increase, per dues-paying member, be used to repay previous years' withdrawals from cash reserves.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE Pensions -- Senate Bill 5380 - The Governor has signed this bill into law. It will raise the current \$13 minimum to \$13.50 on July 1, 1987. Additionally, a maximum three percent cost of living adjustment based on the SeattleConsumer Price Index is provided to the minimum benefit only. SB 5380 affects 6700 retired teachers and 15,2000 PERS retirees. The estimated cost is \$9.8million for the biennium.

Note This is the first time retired teachers have ever received an automatic Cost-of-Living adjustment; and though this small increase to \$13.50 amounts to only \$15 a month (30 years x 50¢), the COLA provision may set a pattern for other TRS COLA legislation. Toward that goal, the Sno-King RTA delegation to the WSRTA Convention (Pasco, June 8-10) will present a resolution stating, "BE IT RESOLVED that the WSRTA Board initiate legal action by employing a firm of attorneys qualified to investigate the feasibility of a suit against the State of Washington to bring TRS into equitable status with other Washington retirement systems with automatic COLAS."
