DIRECTIONS TO MILL CREEK COUNTRY CLUB

From I-5 take exit #183 which puts you on 164th SW. HEALTHFUL RECIPE FROM OUR HEALTH CARE COMMITTEE

HALIBUT IN TARRAGON

This recipe is a healthful adaptation of a recipe used by a famous Hawaiian restaurant. It is wonderful for entertaining.

15 pounds halibut cheeks or steaks

5 cup low-fat yogurt

1 Thsp. mayonnaise

1 tsp. tarragon

3/4 cup part-skim mozzarella cheese, grated

Place halibut in 8" x 8" baking pan. Mix all other ingredients together and spread over halibut. Bake at 400° for 15 minutes, or until fish flakes when tested with a fork. Serve with steamed carrots and cold pasta salad. Serves 6 (This recipe supplies, per serving: 240 calories, 75 mg. cholesterol, 8.5 grams of fat, and 260 mg. of sodium.)

HEALTH TIP FROM OUR HEALTH CARE COMMITTEE

DECAFFEINATED COFFEE (Excerpts from Harvard Medical School Health Letter - October 1986)

Caffeine can be removed from coffee beans with any of several extracting fluids currently in use: methylene chloride, ethyl acetate, water, or natural coffee oils. Whatever process is used, the solvent should, in theory, be removed from the coffee along with the caffeine, but some residual levels are bound to remain.

In the U.S. methylene chloride is used by General Foods, the marketer of Maxwell House, Sanka, Brim and Yuban. The Nestle' Company, which markets Taster's Choice, Maragor Gold, and Nescafe', uses a Swiss-patented water process and natural oils. The Procter and Gamble Company (Folger's, High Point), uses ethyl acetate, a chemical usually considered to have a relatively low potential for toxicity. (However, little information is available on ethyl acetate's long-term health effects, including cancer.) A number of premium-priced coffees sold in gournet stores are decaffeinated with a Swiss water process.
